



WARK FAMILY SHIRAZ 2014 (94 POINTS, JAMES HALLIDAY)

A wine black in colour, brimming with plums, dark fruits, warm spices and ripe tannins. All the stuff you want to hear when people talk about top Barossa Shiraz. The second release from the 2014 vintage continues the tradition. Rich and flavoursome Shiraz fruit with the ripe tannins to match.

BIG JIM SHIRAZ 2014 (94 POINTS, JAMES HALLIDAY)

This wine is black in the glass and the rich Shiraz flavours are super concentrated courtesy of the low yields in the vineyard. 18 months ageing in a mix of 50% new French hogsheads and 50% seasoned oak has lifted the spice notes to a new level and given the wine really fine structure. Marnie Wark was given the task of bringing Big Jim to life in a painting to grace the front label...a big, black, bold and impressive bird he is, just like the wine that bears his name.

PLAYGROUND 'S6 MILLION' SHIRAZ 2011 (93 POINTS, TYSON STELZER)

Eden Valley...high altitude...2011, a cooler, wetter year than ever known...'Spog' Forrest's Shiraz...late March...fruit at 10 baumé and losing the battle with mould...a vineyard barely alive. Enter Kym Teusner..."Gentlemen. We can rebuild this Shiraz. We have the technology. We have the fruit and the capability to make a Shiraz that will have those cool climate loving, skinny jean wearing, beard growing hipsters doing donuts on their Vespas. Spog's Shiraz will be that wine. Different to what it was last year....spicier...more north Rhone....less south Rhone."

ALBERT SHIRAZ 2013 (94 POINTS, THE WINE FRONT)

From old Barossa Valley vineyards which typically yield fruit of concentrated flavour and soft, supple and velvety tannins that set them apart from the younger stuff. The Ebenezer block gives this wine its dark core and its muscle, with the fruit from Williamstown providing elegance, fragrance and spice. There's plenty of blackberry, black satsuma plum, black cherry and cassis with great intensity and length.

RIEBKE SHIRAZ 2014 (92 POINTS, JAMES HALLIDAY)

The Riebke tradition continues...rich, abundant flavour and serious drinkability whilst also being easy on the pocket. The wine is jam packed with Barossa Shiraz flavours....plums, black fruits and warm spices. We've taken it easy on the oak to allow the fruit to take center stage...as you would when it's this good. This is a plush, vibrant wine of immense generosity and incredible value.

BILMORE SHIRAZ 2015 (THE 2014 VINTAGE RATED 96 POINTS BY JAMES HALLIDAY)

Our Bilmore Shiraz is sourced from vineyards along the western ridge of the Valley floor...an area stretching south of Seppeltsfield Road, around the back of the golf club at Rowland Flat and then on through the parish of Gomersal that overlooks the southern township of Lyndoch. Shiraz grown in these parts produces richly flavoured wines with soft, round mouth feel and plenty of delicious savoury characters. Seeking to place a pure expression of Shiraz flavour center stage here, we've gone easy on the oak using only older, seasoned barrels for the job of maturing for around 12 months.
